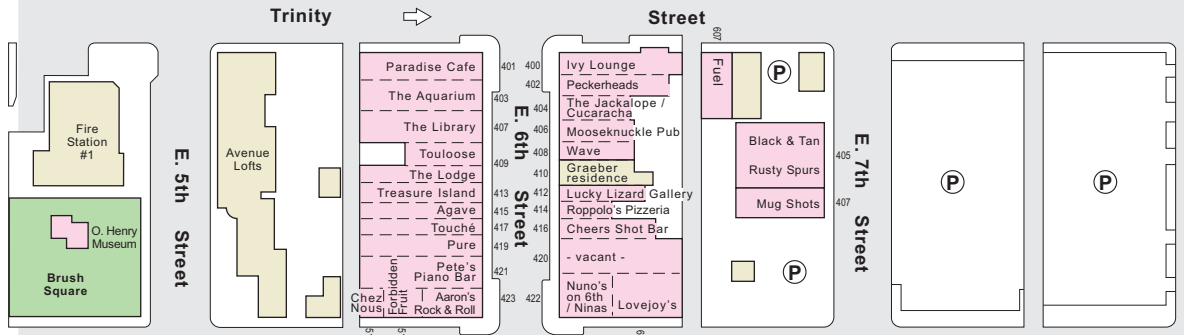
E. 6th St. / Red River St. Entertainment Area
